## Prior to coming to work self-screening criteria

- ➤ All personnel should self-screen before arriving on site. If any symptoms associated with COVID-19 are present, you should NOT report to work and inform your supervisor. If the symptoms are subsequently determined to be unrelated to COVID-19, you may report to work as normal.
- ➤ Temperature screening upon entry into any EN property is optional. For additional information on self-screening for COVID-19, refer to the *Energy Northwest COVID-19 Site Access Screening Checklist*.
- ➤ Follow social distancing requirements while taking your temperature at the temperature screening station.
- ➤ 100.4 °F is considered a high temperature and is consistent with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines associated with COVID-19; this temperature is equivalent to a temperature of 99.2 °F on the self-screen monitors.
- > If you have a high temperature, notify your supervisor and go home.

## **Self-screening stations**

- Temperature screening stations are located as follows:
  - o MPF In the hallway near the Skamania and Walkley conference rooms
  - Kootenai outside the Kennedy Room and east entrance
  - Deschutes Primary entrances to Deschutes Building (north and south)
  - Building 184 Primary entrances (east and south)
  - Building 11 Primary entrances (north and south)
  - PAAP Primary entrances (north and south)

## <u>Temperature Screening Instruction</u>

- 1. Step up to the machine and follow the prompts.
- 2. Verify that your temperature is less than 99.2 °F, which is equivalent to 100.4 °F under the tongue according to the manufacture.
- 3. If you receive a high-temp notice, flip the sign to out of service, contact your supervisor and go home.
- 4. The supervisor will contact Facilities to have the area cleaned.

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
